Staff Update

We have several new staff this session and we would like to extend the warmest welcome to them. Welcome to our new Support for Learning Workers Ms Adamson and Ms Paterson who have joined us and our teaching staff Miss Sweeney (P3a Mon/Tues, P4b Wed – Fri), Mrs Preston (P2a Mon/Tues), Mrs Butler (Wed-Fri), Miss Madan P2b, Mrs Welch P5b and Miss Palmer P7a. Open afternoon

We would like to invite you to the school on Tuesday 13th September any time between 3.15pm and 5.15pm. We are having an open afternoon to allow you to visit your child's/children's classes and to meet the staff working with them. Preloved uniforms, lost property (there is quite a mountain already) and teas and coffees will be available in the gym hall. You can also have a look round other parts of the school and visit our new Literacy Lounge on the top floor of the main building. We hope you can make it along!

COVID update

We return to school following the risk assessment and guidance issued just prior to the summer holidays. We are delighted to welcome parents and carers back into the school and look forward to event through out the school year. COVID is still with us and we have continued with a proportionate approach to mitigations; children continue to handwash at regular intervals through the day with hand sanitizer being readily available, windows are open to ensure ventilation and all members of the school community are advised to stay at home if they feel unwell.

Road safety

As a reminder, we are a car free zone from 8.15am until 9 am and again at 2.30pm to 3.15pm. This means that you cannot drive or park in the four streets that immediately surround the school during these times unless you have a resident's permit. You should also not:

- park or stop on the keep clear zones which are clearly marked on the corners;
- stop in the middle of the road to let your child out;
- park on the zig zag lines outside the school.

I have requested support from our community police colleagues for this important safety measure. They have provided us with an email address, which is available on request, for members of the community to report concerns directly to them.

Cordia news

For new families to the school, the Breakfast Club is open to all every morning in the school hall from 7.45am at the cost of £2 for your first child and £1 thereafter for any siblings or free for families who are in receipt of certain tax credits. There is no need to book or attend every day. The school lunch price is £1.90 this session for children in P6 and P7 as school meals are free for all children from P1-P5. Both these services can be paid for through Parent Pay in addition to children ordering their lunch the day before.

<u>P.E.</u>

P1 – P4 children will have an indoor and outdoor PE slot this term. Children in P5-P7 will have one PE slot in the school gym hall and from early September participate in Activity Block between Scotstoun Leisure Centre and school on a Tuesday afternoon. In all classes, children should come to school on their PE days in their PE kit which is a house t-shirt, school sweatshirt and shorts or jogging trousers. On their outdoor PE day, they should also have a waterproof jacket. They should not wear any jewellery, including earrings. Sometimes PE times change through the year to accommodate coaches etc., we will endeavour to keep you up to date with any changes.

Health and Safety

We would ask that you keep us up to date with any medical conditions your child may have. In addition, if your child has to take medicine for a brief period of time, please contact the school office to complete a form which allows us to administer that.

We are also a nut free school as we have children who are allergic to nuts. Please do not send nuts or sweets with nuts in them into school. Thank you for your support with this.

Could you please ensure that everything your child bring to school is label with their name? We already have some lost property which we cannot return to its owner as there is no way of identifying them.

Pupil absence

Within Glasgow Primary School good attendance is encouraged at all times. Parents are asked to contact the Pupil Absence Reporting Line if their child is going to be absent (0141 287 0039) or report online. This should be done before 9.30 on the first day of absence. If the child is going to be absent for some time, it would be helpful to know at the earliest opportunity. The school uses daily text messaging to inform parents of their child's absence if no contact is made. All unexplained absence is investigated by the school and appropriate action taken.

Please phone the Pupil Absence Reporting Line to report the following absences:

- Sickness absence: if the absence lasts more than one day, parents and carers are required to call on subsequent days to provide an update. A letter should be provided to the school when the child returns from their absence.
- Medical or dental appointments: Parents and carers should call the PARL to report absences for medical or dental appointments. The school requires a letter or appointment card as evidence of the appointment to ensure permission is given to be absent from class.

To make sure you receive the right support you require, parents and carers should still contact the school directly to report absences of a sensitive or personal nature, for example:

- Bereavement
- Serious illness, for example, an absence which is going to last more than one week
- Injury, for example, broken limb
- Contagious diseases or illness
