Play together on pedals

This is a free 6 programme for all Primary 2 children aimed at getting everyone cycling or if children can cycle already, improve their skills and confidence. The organisers provide instructors and bikes

so that everyone can take part. This programme has seen children learn how to cycle in a really short period and they have been having great fun!!

Car free zone

Please remember that the car free zone is still in operation during the hours of 8.15 – 9.00am and 2.30pm until 3.15pm. However, cars displaying a permit are allowed to drive through the area during these hours. Parents should not approach or stop cars. It is still an issue in some cases and has been more noticeable when we have had bad weather. We are looking to work further with our community link police on these ongoing issues. Please ensure that anyone else who is collecting your child knows about this zone and the times and restrictions in place.

Health and Safety

Head Lice - it is important to regularly wet comb hair to remove head lice and nits. Lice and nits can be removed by wet combing.

You can buy a special fine-toothed comb (detection comb) online or from pharmacies to remove head lice and nits. There may be instructions on the pack, but usually you:

- wash hair with ordinary shampoo
- apply lots of conditioner (any conditioner will do)
- comb the whole head of hair, from the roots to the ends

It usually takes about 10 minutes to comb short hair, and 20 to 30 minutes for long, frizzy or curly hair. Regularly checking and combing will prevent cases of headlice and nits and reduce spread in school.

Scotstoun stars

The Scotstoun Stars took to the stage at Knightswood Secondary School last week to perform their hip-hop routine as part of the City of Dance heats run by the Active School's team. The Stars, made up from girls from P4-P7, performed so well impressing both the audience and their families. The girls, led by the P7s and coached by Jo our Active School's co-ordinator, practiced so hard at lunch time and break times to perfect their routine. We aren't sure if we have made it to the finals in June yet – fingers crossed!
