
January Newsletter

School website

We have been developing a new school website this session and moving away from the current host site to a GLOW Blog - don't worry, no GLOW login is required! It is easier to update, manage and navigate. Mr Boyd, and previously Mrs MacKenzie, have been working at populating it with what we hope will be useful information. We would like to find out what would be helpful for you to have on the website and will be sending out a short survey in early February to ask you some questions about content. We are also asking for anyone with an interest or skill in web design or communications to see if they would be willing to give us a little bit of time to help us finish and launch the school website. Thank you for your help with this.

Car Free Zone

Please remember that the car free zone is in operation from 8.15 - 9.00am and 2.30pm -3.15pm. No cars should access the area around the school unless they have a permit during these hours. It is still an issue in some cases and has been more noticeable when we have had bad weather. Please ensure that anyone else who is collecting your child knows about this zone. There have been a number of £50 fines issued this month as the zone is enforced more rigorously.

Parents' Workshops

We have been looking at our numeracy and maths curriculum over the last two school sessions and implementing Glasgow City Council's approach called Glasgow Counts. Ms Waters has been leading this initiative across the school and will be holding parent workshops to explain some of the strategies and approaches. The first is for P1-P3 parents and will take place on Thursday 16th Feb from 2pm.

Parents' Evening

Parents' evening is an important part of our school calendar as it gives us a chance to meet to discuss children's progress and wellbeing. Although if you have a specific concern, please get in touch outwith parents' evenings to discuss this with us. This term they take place on Tuesday 14th March and Thursday 16th March. Appointments will once again be able to be booked electronically via GroupCall. We all look forward to welcoming you into the building.

Play Approaches at Scotstoun Our play curriculum focussed on P1 and P2 is an area we have been continuing to develop. Last week we had a visit from a leader of learning from Glasgow City Council to speak to staff, observe the learning going on and see how the children interacted with the play opportunities. The visit was a resounding success with our visitor being "blown away" with what they saw. We were very pleased with the feedback! Thanks to all staff for their hard work in this area.

Garden Muck In

We are hosting a series of Garden Muck-Ins to help tidy up our school grounds and MUGA and get them ready for Spring. No gardening expertise necessary - all that's needed is enthusiasm. They take place on Monday 6th Feb and Friday 17th Feb from 3pm until dusk and Saturday 25th Feb from 9.30am until noon (community ground). We will be creating a willow tunnel, revamping planters, creating gardens and building bug hotels. If that sounds of interest then we would love to see you then!
